Grade 1 have been harnessing the power of their imagination in many ways over the last few weeks. As a summative assessment for their unit students heard the beginning and middle of a tale called Neangara. Their task was to come up with a unique ending for the story and decide how to work together to express that ending to their classes in small groups.





Grade 2 have been learning about different traditions, cultures and religions in their unit 'Let's celebrate'. Ms Anu from Grade 1 came into class to share some Hindu traditions and



beliefs and lead the classes in a moment of contemplative meditation.

Grade 3's unit 'The birth of the earth' allowed students to become paleontologists for the day when they went on a dinosaur dig. Students labeled, marked, pegged and extracted their findings carefully to allow them to reassemble their findings when they got back to class.



Grade 4's students have been showing great enthusiasm for their unit 'The Earth and beyond' by bringing in relevant materials from

home to share and demonstrate to their classmates.
